**Harris-Stowe President Selected to the Delta State University
Alumni Hall of Fame Class of 2014**

ST. LOUIS, MO (November 12, 2014) – Harris-Stowe State University President Dr. Dwaun J. Warmack has been selected as a member of the Delta State University (DSU) Alumni Hall of Fame Class of 2014. As part of DSU Homecoming activities, this year's Alumni Hall of Fame inductees will be recognized at the Alumni Awards Gala on Friday, November 14, 2014, at DSU Walter Sillers Coliseum in Cleveland, Miss.

Upon taking presidency at Harris-Stowe in July 2014, Dr. Warmack quickly established the university as an intellectual think tank committed to tackling the various educational, political and economic challenges that face our region and turning them into opportunities for a greater good.

Receiving both his bachelor's and master's degrees in education from DSU, Dr. Warmack has more than 16 years of experience in higher education and is noted as the youngest president of a university.
