What We Have Done

2005 \$3.2 million Energy Savings Program
This program provided efficient upgraded lighting, central air conditioning and water systems in the Givens Administration Building. Program was funded by an energy loan from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources and private loans payable over 15 years from the savings achieved via lower utility cost.



2009 Opened the University's first "green" building, the William L. Clay, Sr. Early Childhood Development and Parenting Education Center. The building is Silver LEED Certified for new construction by the U.S. Green Building Council.



2010 Awarded UNCF Building Green grant

2010 HSSU joined the Higher Education Sustainability Consortium for the St. Louis Region.



2010 Students attended Show Me Sustainability Conference (Student planned and managed conference addressing campus sustainability issues)

2011 Awarded MLK Day of Service grant (Collaborated with City of St. Louis and Ameren UE to deliver 25,000 compact fluorescent light bulbs to a city ward and clean up the streets.)
