Biography

Dr. Diane M. Smoot graduated from Fontbonne College with a Bachelor's Degree in Music Education. For the next twenty-one years, she taught in the Archdiocese of St. Louis High School System where she taught choral and general music, theology and computers. In 1981, she was awarded a fellowship to Washington University where she earned a Master of Arts in Music Education. In the summer of 1994, she was granted a fellowship from the National Endowment for the Humanities to study the work of Mozart in Vienna, Austria. In 1996, she earned a Master of Science in Computer Education from Fontbonne College, and thereafter, joined the faculty at Harris-Stowe State College. Subsequently she earned a doctorate in Education at Saint Louis University. In 2003, as Harris-Stowe's Educator of the Year, she received an Emerson Excellence in Teaching Award and the Governor's Award for Excellence in Teaching. In 2008 she was awarded the Fontbonne University Distinguished Alumna Award. She currently serves as Associate Professor in Computer Education at Harris-Stowe State University and Chair of the Educational Technology standing committee.
