Writing Assessment Scoring Rubric for the Essay Requirement

The essay is given a score of one (1) to twenty (20) points and it is graded by all members of the committee. The scores are averaged and a maximum of 20 points awarded. Essays are graded on presentation, correct grammar, English usage and the depth of the answer.
