Acad Plan - GPA	You are required to sign an Academic Plan to received federal aid because you are not meeting the standard for Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP). If you do not comply with the plan you will lose your eligibility for federal aid.	Academic Plan- GPA
Acad Plan- Grad Plan	You are required to sign an Academic Plan to received federal aid because you are not meeting the standard for Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP). You have to complete your degree within 150% of the program length. You are either close to or exceeding that amount. The Graduate Plan will ensure that are progressing toward graduation. If you do not comply with the plan you will lose your eligibility for federal aid.	Graduation Plan
Acad Plan - GPA & PACE	You are required to sign an Academic Plan to received federal aid because you are not meeting the standard for Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP). If you do not comply with the plan you will lose your eligibility for federal aid.	Academic Plan- GPA & Pace
Acad Plan - PACE	You are required to sign an Academic Plan to received federal aid because you are not meeting the standard for Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP). If you do not comply with the plan you will lose your eligibility for federal aid.	Academic Plan- Pace
Appeal Denied	Your Satisfactory Academic Programs (SAP) appeal was denied. This means that you are not eligible for any federal student aid. Please contact the Bursars office to set up a payment plan.	N/A
Appeal Granted	Your Satisfactory Academic Programs (SAP) appeal was approved. This means that you are eligible for federal student aid. Please review your file, we may need additional documents from you to finish processing.	N/A
Appeal Letter Received	The Office of Financial Assistance has received your Satisfactory Academic Programs (SAP) appeal letter.	N/A
